Period product dispenser guidelines and options

Period product dispensers are <u>allowed</u> to be purchased with funds from the Georgia Feminine Hygiene Grant. Before purchasing and installing any dispensers, <u>please review all of the information</u> in this document – including dispenser guidelines, options, and important considerations.

Guidelines

Dispensers include any container or machine that makes period supplies readily available to students (e.g., wallmounted machines, rolling carts).

To be eligible for purchase with the Feminine Hygiene Grant funds, dispensers must:

- Provide products **free of charge** to students
- Be installed or placed <u>in student bathrooms or common spaces</u>

2 <u>Dispenser options</u>

	Price per unit range
Mechanical wall units	\$295-500
Products on a roll (like toilet paper)	Contact distributor
Countertop baskets	\$2-25
Hanging baskets	\$25-50
Freestanding storage drawers	\$45-300
Envelope or file affixed to the wall	\$15-50

Important considerations

Prior to purchasing any dispensers, contact maintenance and operations staff to foster partnership and establish buy-in. Collaboratively determine which dispenser(s) would be appropriate, where to install them, and what will be needed to make them effective and sustainable (e.g., who will restock products).

<u>Disposal needs</u> and <u>signage or education</u> to accompany dispenser use and proper disposal of products will also be critical to consider. Trash receptacles or disposal bags should be located in a private, easily accessible location to allow students to dispose of products discretely. <u>See options</u> <u>here</u>.
